

Drug Products for Minor Ailments and Contraception

Disclaimers: This document is for informational purposes only and may not capture all commercially available prescription products that fit under approved drug categories for pharmacist minor ailment and contraception prescribing, or non-prescription products that may be recommended. This document also does not provide information on treatment selection (E.g. first line vs. second line therapies).

Per HPA Bylaws [Schedule F Part 8 - Standards, Limits and Conditions](#) a pharmacist must **only prescribe a drug** if the intended use is for an indication **approved by Health Canada**, or for an **off-label indication**, that is: a) **considered a best practice** or **accepted clinical practice** in peer-reviewed clinical literature; or b) part of an **approved research protocol**.
